Parkside Phase 1 and Proposed Link Road

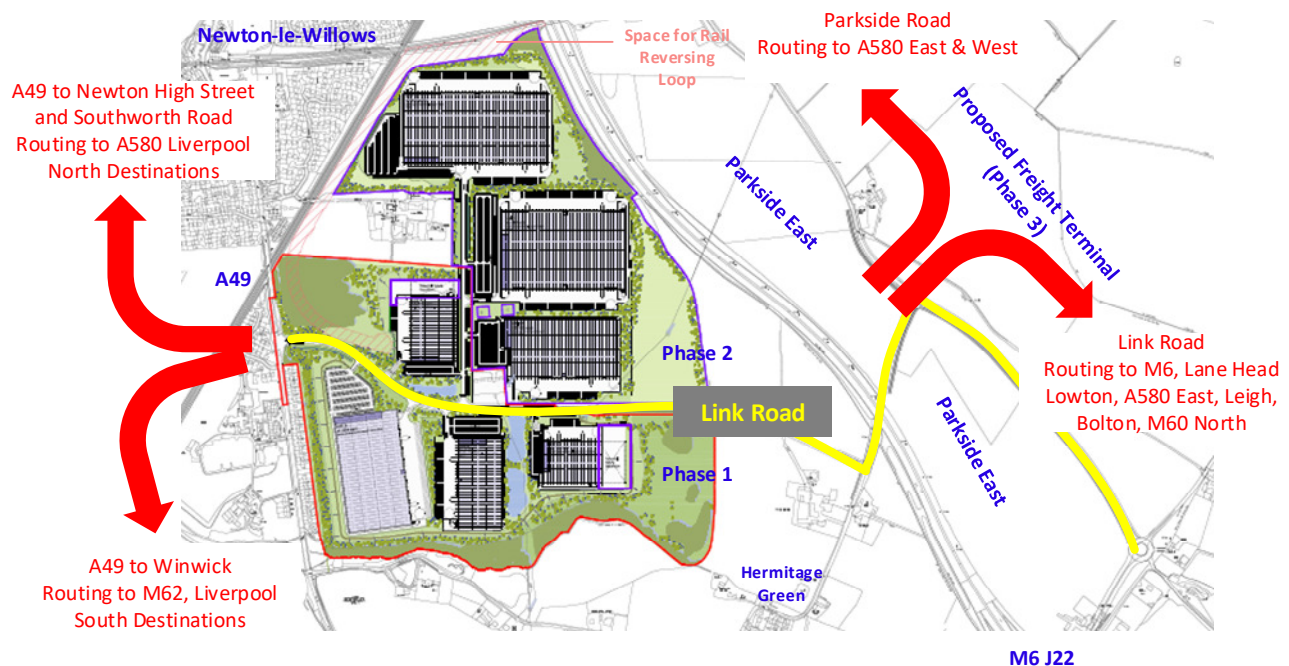


The developments proposed by Langtree Regeneration and St Helens Council will potentially place thousands of extra vehicles on our local roads.

Thank you to those who already objected to the Phase 1 application. We now need your help to object to the Link Road application too. If nobody objects, then the Council is likely to believe the link road proposal is sound. Further details can be found on our web site at www.parksideactiongroup.org.uk.

The consultants commissioned by the Council have stated that the link road is required to remediate traffic issues on the local road infrastructure but we believe the link road will simply provide better access for thousands of extra vehicles using the site to use our local roads. It will also open Parkside East for more warehouses and even more traffic. Some of our local roads pass through Air Quality Management Areas which encompass residential, pedestrian and school routes. Air quality which is near or has already previously surpassed UK and European limits will be made even worse by the extra traffic in these areas.
